# **EXPECTATIONS**

MAINTAIN SEEDS AT THE HEART OF **ALL PRODUCTION SYSTEMS FOR RICH,** COMPETITIVE AND DIVERSIFIED FRENCH AGRICULTURE IMPLIES THAT POLITICAL **DECISIONS AND THE SPECIFICITIES** OF THE SEED BUSINESS MUST

BE RECONCILED.

- Prioritise policy directions to enable breeding to pursue a multitude of objectives (taste, disease resistance, drought, carbon) while taking into account time and resource constraints.
- Consider the high level of requirements for seed production in decisions relating to the means of production (plant health, irrigation, carbon, etc.).

- Support a regulatory framework which, with the involvement of the public authorities, is designed to guarantee access to the French and European market for seed diversity, while providing users and consumers with excellence in terms of quality.
- Support higher education and agricultural technical education
- Support public and private research through significant investments in all the levers of the agro-ecological transition, including new genomic techniques and agronomic innovations.

Its seed breeders, growers and producers are capable of meeting these challenges.

However, it will be all the stronger if it can count on the support of public authorities.

Together, we can play our part in achieving the great ambitions for the France of tomorrow.
